Program Information

- Where: National Weather Service Weather Forecast Office, Grand Rapids, MI
- What: A limited number of Student Volunteer positions will be available. It is expected that students will achieve the following:
 - A broad knowledge of the NWS mission, operations, and services
 - o An understanding of how the NWS integrates science into its services
 - o An ability to use forecasting tools to diagnose and predict the weather
 - A graphical approach to conveying forecasts, including probabilistic information
 - A greater comprehension of how NWS partners use our forecast information
 - A better awareness of career options in meteorology
- When: This program runs from late May until late August

Eligibility

- Students must be enrolled at a college or university at least half time during the entire internship period
- Those in undergraduate, graduate, and doctoral programs are welcome to apply
- Students who are graduating in Spring 2024 and are not enrolled in a program in Fall 2024 are not eligible
- Students who have taken synoptic and dynamic meteorology courses are preferred
- Applicants who have not taken synoptic/dynamic or are pursuing a degree in a closely related science (ie. Environmental Science, Climatology, Hydrology, etc.) are still welcome to apply

Required Application Materials (send a zipped file to brandon.hoving@noaa.gov by 11:59pm 2/29)

- **Cover letter** (one page) demonstrating the following:
 - o Why you want to volunteer at a National Weather Service office
 - o Your primary interests (ie. severe weather, hydrology, programming, etc.)
 - o Anything else that tells us about your skills and abilities
- **Resumé** that includes your academic standing, anticipated major/minor or advanced degree, noteworthy academic achievements, extracurricular or personal accomplishments, advisor's name and contact information, recent employment experience, etc.
- Unofficial transcripts from any and all colleges you have attended
