#### New Penn State Turnitin Login

New this fall, Penn State community members are able to log in to Turnitin.com using their Access Account ID and password through a new URL, <http://turnitin.psu.edu>.

If you are creating a new account, using this URL will allow you to skip several steps.

If you are using an existing account, documents, assignments, and classes will automatically be available if the account was created using your Access Account ID. **If you used a different email account as your Turnitin ID when you originally created your account, you will need to change your Turnitin User ID to match your Penn State Access Account ID at Turnitin.com before logging in through the new URL.**

Turnitin.com ( <http://turnitin.com> ) is a Web-based plagiarism detection and prevention system owned by Turnitin.com, Inc., to which Penn State has a subscription. Turnitin.com can be used as a means to teach students how to work with sources and to raise awareness of paraphrasing and quoting skills in order to avoid plagiarism.
